Reading Contract for Parents and The Orchard School

This contract recognises the important role and responsibility of the parents and the school in working together to support a child's progress and success in reading.

As such, we commit to:

- Respect school staff, children, parents, administrators and community.
- Be excited about literacy, reading and learning to read.
- Create a buzz about reading for pleasure in a variety of ways.

To support my child in learning to read, I will:

- Invite my child to read with me every day.
- Explore books together using your senses touching, smelling, hearing etc.
- Stop and ask about the picture and about what is happening in the story.
- Read a variety of children's books.
- Talk with my child's teacher about my child's reading progress.
- Discuss stories we have read together.
- Give feedback to my child's class about the books they have read.
- Ask my child questions about what was read.
- Parents are responsible for any books sent home. It is expected that all borrowed reading books will be returned to school once complete – every two weeks.
- If any books are damaged or lost, you will be sent a letter, text or a note in the diary. It is expected that a payment will be made to the school of £5 so that a replacement can be purchased.

In my work leading the school, we will:

- Work towards parental involvement in supporting their children's reading and homework.
- School will send a book to share with your child out every two weeks.
- School will ask for your feedback on how your child responded to the story or book you have explored with them.
- School will send a book appropriate to your child's level.
- School will support parents in how to read with your child at home.
